

Biopsy Pathology Of The Breast

MICROSCOPIC DESCRIPTION:

- A. Histologic sections demonstrate fragments of breast tissue and adipose tissue. There is a significant increase in dense connective tissue about ducts and lobules within the breast tissue proper. A striking degree of intraductal epithelial hyperplasia is absent. Significant inflammation is not seen.
- B. Examination of multiple sections submitted as left breast biopsy 6:00 reveal additional fragments of fat and breast tissue. The breast tissue proper again shows a significant increase in dense connective tissue about ducts and lobules. A significant degree of intraductal epithelial hyperplasia is absent. No malignancy is observed.

In a needle biopsy, a needle is used to remove a sample of an abnormal area. An excision biopsy removes the entire abnormal area, often with some of the surrounding normal tissue. An excision biopsy is much like a type of breast-conserving surgery called a lumpectomy. A procedure called a biopsy removes a piece of tissue from the lump or spot to find out if cancer cells are present. The pathology report will tell you what kinds of cells are present. If the cancer has grown into normal tissues, it is called invasive. Most breast cancers are invasive. 3 days ago A written breast cancer pathology report follows a biopsy or surgical procedure. Needle biopsy reports may contain less information than surgical biopsy reports. Also, some tests are only done when invasive breast cancer or certain types of.
